The Children's Theatre Company's adaptation of the classic book and animated TV special has been delighting local audiences for years, thanks to Reed Sigmund's raucous performance as the Grinch, whimsical staging, cartoonish costumes and eye-popping special effects, such as the Grinch and his dog Max flying through the air in their sleigh. Rounded out by a sevenpiece live band, original musical score enthusiastically sung by the cast and a heart-tugging performance by Mabel Weismann as Cindy-Lou Who, the show just might make your heart grow three sizes.
